



Lacing Voyager 5-Button Boots

We hope you love your Voyager boots! The boots should feel a little tight at first, as the leather will stretch and mold to the shape of your feet over time. Your boots will arrive laced up, so if this is your first time wearing them then we recommend studying how the laces look before untying. To prevent damage, be careful not to overtighten the buttons.




Step 1

Loosen lace and open boot flap down to the bottom, but leave lace threaded through all of the leather tabs. Step into the boot and tuck the flap all the way in around your shin to avoid wrinkles. For best fit, slide your heel to the back and keep leg at 90° while lacing.



Step 5

After you wrap the lace around the top button, make a 3" loop with the remaining length.



Step 2

Pull on the lace above the first tab at an angle toward the front of the boot. The leather tabs act as locking mechanisms that hold tension as you lace the boot.




Step 6

Pass the loop down behind the top lace, but in front of the lower lace leading to the top button.




Step 3

Pull lace over the top of the lowest button and wrap it around the bottom of the button. Then pull the slack through the next tab until it is comfortably snug, using the button as an anchor. You should feel leather tightening around your instep and ankle.




Step 7

Pull the loop forward. This creates a slip knot that should will hold your lacing tension securely.



Step 4

Continue this process with the remaining buttons by pulling lace through the top of the next pull tab, wrapping it around top of the next button and pulling through the next pull tab until snug. The lace should crisscross between the buttons and tabs.



Step 8

Trim any excess lace and enjoy! To release the knot and undo the lacing, simply pull the end of the lace toward the back of the boot.
